

# CR-200/300 Corrosion Sensor Operation Manual

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# 1. Introduction

The Pyxis CR-200/300 corrosion sensor measures the metal corrosion rate in an aqueous environment based on the principle of linear polarization resistance (LPR). A small polarization DC voltage is applied to two test metal electrodes and the resulting current is measured by the sensor. The polarization resistance value is calculated from the measured current and the applied polarization voltage. The metal corrosion rate in the unit of thousandths of inch per year (or mils per year, MPY) is then determined as:

Equation 1.  $MPY = B/R_p$ ,

where  $R_p$  is the polarization resistance (LPR) and B the proportional constant.

To calculate Rp originated from the electrochemical reaction at the metal water interface, the Pyxis CR-200/300 sensor subtracts the solution resistance Rs due to the test solution conductivity from the total resistance measured between the two test electrodes. The Pyxis CR-200/300 sensor accurately measures the test solution conductivity using the two test electrodes and the bipolar pulse technique, which has been successfully used in other Pyxis conductivity sensors and handheld meters.

A challenge of using the LPR method to measure corrosion rate below 0.01 MPY is to measure electric current in the range of pico and nano-amperes. The Pyxis CR-200/300 sensor adapts a range of techniques that are practiced in our fluorometers where low pico ampere current is measured. These techniques include electromagnetic interference shielding, special analog circuit designs, and digital signal processing.

The proportional constant B has a theoretical value for a given metal type and size. The Pyxis CR-200/300 assumes B equal to 1.24 MPY· $\Omega$  for a 5 cm<sup>2</sup> mild steel electrode, which is a typical value that has been used in many LPR corrosion researches. This proportional constant may be also referred as to the alloy factor of the test metal and normalized to 1.0 for the steel electrode for convivence. It can be adjusted by the user to account for variations in a real application environment.

To determine the corrosion situation of real process equipment is not a simple matter. The corrosion rates for various metal surfaces contacting aqueous fluids in a process depends on many parameters, including the corrosivity pertaining to the chemistry of the aqueous fluid, physical parameters such as temperature and the velocity of the fluid, and the metallurgical composition of the process equipment itself. Because of this, the corrosion rate measured by the Pyxis CR-200/300 should not be used alone to predict or assess the real corrosion rate of the process equipment. Nevertheless, the science of using the LPR technique to quantify the corrosion rate has been well established. The corrosion rate measured by the Pyxis CR-200/300 sensor can be used to understand the corrosivity trend of the aqueous fluid over a period and its correlation to changes in the process parameters.

Measuring corrosion rate using a weight loss corrosion coupon is still widely practiced in many industry applications. LPR is an instantaneous method compared with the corrosion coupon method. It can indicate a change in corrosion rate in a time scale of a few minutes. In theory, a time averaged corrosion rate measured by the Pyxis LPR sensor should agree with that from the weight loss coupon method if both are practiced according to the common practices known in the industry. For monitoring mild steel corrosion

rate in an industrial cooling water system, one could also treat the LPR metal electrode itself as the weight loss corrosion coupon, and compare the corrosion rate calculated from the weight loss of the electrode to the averaged LPR corrosion rate in order to calibrate the LPR corrosion rate by adjusting the alloy factor.

The electrochemical noise measurement has long been used to quantify the localized corrosion or pitting corrosion rate. The Pyxis CR-200/300 sensor measures the short circuit electric current flowing through the electrodes between the two LPR measurements. The Pyxis sensor first applies a signal process algorithm to remove high frequency noise in the acquired electrochemical current data for a period of 3 minutes and then calculates the standard deviation of the processed data set. The standard deviation calculated is scaled to generate a localized corrosion index. In such a scaling, the index value for a 304-stainless steel electrochemical current noise data are graphically displayed in the Pyxis display panel, an optional item that can be purchased separately. With the graphic trend, the noise pattern and magnitude can be easily analyzed visually.

# 3. Unpackaging the Instrument

Remove the instrument and find the standard accessories from the shipping container as listed below. Inspect each item for any damage that may have occurred during shipping. Verify that all accessory items are included. If any item is missing or damaged, please contact Pyxis Lab Customer Service at <u>service@pyxis-lab.com</u>.

# 4. Installation

The CR-200/300 sensor is shipped without the electrodes installed. A pair of copper and mild steel electrodes are included in the package. Remove the O-rings in the electrode package and place an O-ring to each threaded rod on the sensor. Fasten the electrodes to the threaded rods to slightly compress the O-ring on the bottom of the threaded rod. Clean the electrodes with isopropanol to remove any oil or other foreign materials on the electrode surfaces.




Figure 1. CR-200/300 installation to the sample flow

The sensor probe shall be inserted into a pipe via a 1-inch threaded tee. The corrosion rate measured by the CR-200/300 sensor may be affected by the position of the two-test metal electrodes in relation to the water flow. The electrodes should be fully immersed in the water sample and away from any turbulence. The sensor body has three O-ring grooves to allow the 1-inch male NPT thread to be locked at three positions on the probe with a compression nut. Thus, the depth of the probe insertion in the pipe can be adjusted. For the best performance, the two-test metal electrodes should be installed to be parallel to the flow and maintain a symmetry between the electrodes with respect to the flow environment as much as possible.




Figure 2. CR-200 dimensions in inch [mm]




Figure 3. CR-300 dimensions in inch [mm]

# 5. Test Metal Electrodes

Pyxis provides 5-cm<sup>2</sup> (0.736 square inch) metal electrodes, commonly used in the LPR corrosion measurement applications. The common names, UNS codes, and alloy factors are listed the table below.




Figure 4. Test Metal Electrode Dimensions (inch [mm])

Metal electrodes with a different length and a slightly different diameter could be used with the CR-200/300 sensor as long as the electrodes fit into the 4-40 external thread. The alloy factor for a given metal alloy is proportional to the surface area of the electrode. If an electrode with a surface area different than 5 cm<sup>2</sup> (0.736 square inch) is used, please calculate the alloy factor according to the surface area and the alloy factor listed above.

# 6. CR-300 Quick 4-20mA Start

The CR-300 comes with 4-20mA transmitters embedded in the sensor body. It outputs two channels of 4-20mA signals that represent general corrosion rate and localized corrosion rate respectively.

Converting the 4-20 mA output from the CR-300 to a corrosion rate in the unit of MPY can be carried out by setting up one of three configurable parameters. The configurable parameters are the alloy factor, the sensor's 4-20 mA range, and the controller's 4-20 mA range. The first two reside in the CR-200/300 sensor itself and can be configured by using the uPyxis app (reference Section 8 for details). The third approach is in the controller's 4-20 mA range and must be configured according to the controller instruction/procedure. Pyxis provides two calibration check caps that can easily be used to verify the controller's 4-20 mA range for steel and copper corrosion measurements.

The user can set up just one of the three parameters to convert the sensor output to a meaningful MPY value. Optionally, the user can change one of three, two, or all three parameters to achieve the best result for a specific measurement situation, such as ultra-low corrosion rate measurement for copper.

### 6.1. Wiring

Follow the wiring table below to connect the CR-300 probe to a controller. The grey wire and the brown wire are the power ground and internally connected. The grey wire can be used for the 4-20 mA return. The green earth ground wire should be connected to the controller chassis ground if it is available.




Figure 5. Typical Wiring Diagram for WalChem W600




Figure 6. Typical Wiring Diagram for WalChem WebMaster One




Figure 7. Typical Wiring Diagram for Advantage MegaTronSS




Figure 8. Typical Wiring Diagram for Advantage MegaTronXS

## 6.2. Default Settings for Steel Corrosion

The default 4-20 mA current outputs are scaled as:

4 mA = 0 MPY or 0 localized corrosion index 20 mA = 10 MPY (White) 20 mA = 120 (localized)

The sensor is configured to measure the corrosion of mild steel by default. For measuring the corrosion rate of steel, the user just needs to scale 20 mA = 10 MPY in the controller. Please use uPyxis apps to rescale the 4-20 mA output or/and the alloy factor for other metals.

### 6.3. Convert 4-20 mA Output to MPY using the Calibration Check Caps

A 2.0 MPY steel and 0.1 MPY copper calibration check caps are included in the CR-300/200 package. Follow the steps below to configure the controller's 4-20 mA range:

- Install two new test electrodes




Figure 9. Plug the sensor into the calibration cap

- Plug the sensor to the calibration check cap and wait for at least for 15 minutes for the sensor to carry out three measurements (figure 9)
- Change the controller's analog input setup to have the corrosion rate value on the controller match with the value marked on the calibration cap

# 7. CR-200 Bluetooth LPR Sensor

### 7.1. Battery Installation

The 3.6 V ER26500 type of battery should be used as illustrated. This 3.6 v lithium battery is available from Pyxis (Item P/N: 50730).

### WARNING

Please do NOT use type C alkaline batteries for CR-200. Although type C alkaline batteries are in the same dimensions as ER26500 lithium batteries, they are 1.5-volt nominal voltage batteries. CR-200 will NOT work with type C alkaline batteries.

Follow the following steps to install the ER26500 battery to the CR-200.

1. Loosen the two screws that fasten the battery cover plate.




Figure 12. Pull open the battery cover plate slowly

2. Separate the cover plate from the CR-200 body as shown in figure 12. **DO NOT TWIST THE COVER PLATE!**

3. Place a ER26500 battery to the CR-200. Make sure that the positive terminal of the battery is facing out as shown in figure 13.

4. Place the battery cover plate back and fasten the two screws. Please make sure that the flat cable is being fully pushed inside the CR-200 battery compartment and avoid pinching the cable between the CR-200 body and the cover plate.

## 7.2. Turn on and off CR-200

Press ON/OFF button to turn on the sensor and Bluetooth (figure 15). The green indicator light on the left and blue indicator light on the right will be on for two seconds. After that, the green indicator light on the left will flash every 5 seconds continuously to indicator that the sensor is in the measurement mode. The CR-200 will make first measurement immediately. Since each measurement takes three minutes to complete, the first corrosion rate value will be available 3 minutes after being powered on. The time to the next measurement depends on the measurement interval setting in the CR-200. The default measurement interval is one measurement per hour. The measurement interval can be configured via uPyxis PC or phone app.

Press and hold ON/OFF button for 3 seconds to turn off the CR-200. The green indicator light on the left will stop flashing.

### 7.3. Connect CR-200 to uPyxis Phone App

The CR-200 sensor can be connected to the **uPyxis** phone or PC app for configuration and result charting. Download and install the uPyxis phone app from the Apple Store or the google Play Store.

The Bluetooth of the CR-200 can be operated in two modes. The default mode after the battery installation is the beacon mode. At this mode, the corrosion measured is broadcasted as an encrypted Bluetooth beacon. The Pyxis **uPyxis** phone or PC app reads and interprets the CR-200 beacon to obtain the corrosion rate.

Press and hold the mode button on the top of the sensor for 5 seconds to switch to the connectable peripheral (pairing) mode. In this mode, the **uPyxis** app can pair with the CR-200 sensor. After pairing, the **uPyxis** app can configure the sensor and display the corrosion rate result.

#### 7.3.1. Read CR-200 by uPyxis Phone App




Figure 17. uPyxis showing the results of the connected CR-200

Press the power button to turn on the CR-200. The CR-200 will be in the default beacon mode. Turn on the phone's Bluetooth first and then launch the app. The app will automatically scan the Pyxis Bluetooth devices. Select the desired CR-200, identified by the series number (SN), from the list of the discovered devices to connect (figure 16). After connection, the app will display and chart the corrosion rate of the CR-200 (figure 17).

#### 7.3.2. Configure CR-200 via uPyxis Phone App

Press and hold the Bluetooth mode button on the CR-200 for 20 seconds (or until the Bluetooth indicator light is on) to switch to the pairing mode. In this mode, the Bluetooth mode indicator light will be flashing. Turn on the phone's Bluetooth first and then launch the app. The app will automatically scan the Pyxis Bluetooth devices. Select the desired CR-200 from the list of the discovered devices to connect (figure 16). After connection, tap **Setting** tab to launch the setup page (figure 18).

When the configuration is complete, quit the uPyxis app to allow the CR-200 to automatically switch back to the beacon mode to save the battery power.

### 7.4. Output 4-20 mA via BTA-100 adapter

The corrosion rate can also be converted to a 4-20 mA output that can be wired to a controller's 4-20 mA input terminal via Pyxis BTA-100 as illustrated in figure 19 (P/N: 50729).

The default 4-20 mA current outputs are scaled as:

- 4 mA = 0 MPY or 0 localized corrosion index
- 20 mA = 10 MPY (White)
- 20 mA = 120 (localized)

The sensor is configured to measure the corrosion of mild steel. For measuring the corrosion rate of steel, the user just need to scale 20 mA = 10 MPY in the controller to which the BTA-100 is connected. Please use uPyxis apps to re-scale the 4-20 mA output or/and the alloy factor for other metals. The 2.0 MPY steel and 0.1 MPY copper calibration check caps can be used to check if the controller's 4-20 mA scale is set up correctly.

Follow the steps to establish CR-200 to BTA-100 connection in the beacon-to-reader mode.

- Switch CR-200 to the beacon mode (the indicator light id off).
- Press the power button to turn on the BTA-100 adapter. Switch the BTA-100 to the observer mode (Bluetooth mode indicator "O" on the BTA-100 screen). The BTA-100 adapter will automatically discover all nearby Bluetooth devices and list the discovered Bluetooth derive MAC addresses on the screen.

Use the selection button  $\triangleright$  to scroll to the MAC address that belongs to the CR-200 sensor and press the enter button  $\checkmark$  to establish the reader-to-beacon relationship. The last four digits of the Bluetooth Mac address are laser marked on the CR-200 body.

# 8. CR-200/300 Advanced Configuration

The default configuration of the CR-200/300 sensors before shipping is to measure the corrosion rate of mild steel. The alloy factor was set to be the theoretical value of iron. The sensor can be configured for other metals with alloy factors and the 4-20 mA ranges different from the default using the Pyxis **uPyxis** Desktop in Windows.

### 8.1. Install uPyxis Desktop

Download the latest version of **uPyxis** Desktop software package from: <u>http://www.pyxis-</u> <u>lab.com/support.html#Software</u>. This setup package will download and install .Net Framework 4.5 (if not installed on the PC before), the USB driver for the USB-Bluetooth adapter, the USB-RS485 adapter, and the main uPyxis Desktop application.

Double click the **uPyxis.Setup.exe** file to install.




Figure 20. uPyxis Desktop installation screenshot


Click **Install** to start the installation process. Follow the screen instruction to complete the USB driver and uPyxis installation.


## 8.2. Connection to Apps

The CR-200 sensor has its built-in Bluetooth. It can be paired directly with the Pyxis **uPyxis** app. The CR-300 can be connected to the apps via Pyxis **WiFi/Bluetooth adapter** (P/N: MA-WB) through either Bluetooth or WiFi connection. In addition, the CR-300 can be connected to a PC with using the Pyxis **USB adapter** (P/N: MA-485). The connection options are listed below. Further instructions are given in the following sections (8.3.1 – 8.3.4).




Figure 22. Select a connection Method

#### 8.2.1. Connect CR-300 via USB

Connect the CR-300 sensor to a Windows computer using a USB-485 adapter. Properly connect the USB adapter to the probe and the 24V power supplier (i.e. standard controller or UC-300 etc.) as shown in figure 23. Double click the uPyxis icon (a) to launch the program. The uPyxis application will detect the com port number and set up the communication parameters automatically. Click menu Device -> Connect via USB-RS485 as shown in Figure 14 to connect to the CR-300 sensor. If the connection is successful, the CR-300 sensor and its Serial Number will be displayed in the left pane of the uPyxis window. Measurement will be updated with probe measurement values at a frequency according to the CR-300 measurement frequency. The default is 5 minutes per measurement.

If the connection fails, please check the power supplier and make sure that the probe/adapter/power supplier are connected according to Figure 23.

#### 8.2.2. Connect CR-300 to PC via WiFi

Connect the CR-300 sensor to a Windows computer using a MA-WB adapter according to following steps:

- 1. Connect the probe to the WiFi/Bluetooth adapter first and then connect the adapter to the controller or a 24VDC power supply according to Figure 24.
- 2. Double click the uPyxis.exe icon  $\bigcirc$  to launch the program.
- 3. On uPyxis Desktop, click menu Device -> Connect via WiFi as shown in Figure 21.
- 4. Click the Refresh button to locate the hotspot and then click the Connect to Device button as shown by Figure 25.

Note: After the sensor and WiFi/Bluetooth is powered up, it may take up to 10 seconds for the adapter to establish the wireless signal for communication.

Connect the CR-300 sensor to a Windows computer using a MA-WB adapter via Bluetooth according to following steps:

- 1. Connect the probe to the WiFi/Bluetooth adapter first and then connect the adapter to the controller or a 24VDC power supply according to Figure 26.
- 2. Plug the Bluetooth USB Adapter to a PC USB port.
- 3. Double click the uPyxis.exe icon  $\bigcirc$  to launch the program.
- 4. On uPyxis Desktop, click menu Device -> Connect via Bluetooth as shown in Figure 21.

Connect the CR-200 to a Windows computer using a MA-WB adapter via Bluetooth according to following steps:

- 1. Plug the Bluetooth USB adapter to a PC USB port.
- 2. Press On/Off button to turn on CR-200 and switch to the paring mode (indicator on).
- 3. Double click the uPyxis.exe icon to launch the program.
- 4. On uPyxis Desktop, click menu Device -> Connect via Bluetooth as shown in Figure 21.

### 8.3. Set up

#### 8.3.1. Select Metallurgy and Set up Alloy Factor

Select metallurgy from the Metal selection dropdown. A default alloy factor will be filled in the Alloy Factor field. The default alloy factor is calculated according to equation 1 and listed in the table in Section 5. The user could adjust this factor to make the corrosion rate measured by the sensor best match the corrosion rate determined by other means such as metal coupon weight loss.

#### 8.3.2. 4-20 mA Output Setup

The default setting for the corrosion rate 4-20 mA output is 20 mA = 10 MPY and 4 mA = 0 MPY. The default setting for the pitting index is 20 mA = 120 and 4 mA = 0. The user can change the 4-20 mA scale by filling the fields shown in figure 27.

It is recommended to set up the 4-20 mA current output to 20 mA = 1.0 MPY for the measurement of copper corrosion below 0.1 MPY.

#### 8.3.3. Set up Reading Interval

The default reading interval is 5 minutes per measurement. This parameter can be set to 1, 2, 5, or 30 minutes per measurement (figure 27). Please note that the interval must be set to 5 or 30 minutes for the sensor to measurement the localized corrosion index.

# 9. Connection to Pyxis display Panel UC-300




Figure 28. UC-300 dashboard showing measured corrosion rate and trend chart

The Pyxis UC-300 can provide 24 VDC power to two CR-300 sensors. The panel connects to the sensor by Modbus and reads the sensor data every 4 seconds. The trends of the corrosion rates and localized corrosion indexes (or pitting index) from the two connected sensors can be displayed and recorded (figure 28). The panel passes the four (4) 4-20mA current signals, two (2) from each sensor, to other controllers. An alarm on the general corrosion rate for each probe can be set up. The panel turns on a relay output if an alarm condition is met. Please reference the UC-300 manual for further information.

# **10.** Communicating using Modbus RTU

The CR-300 can be configured as a Modbus slave device. In addition to the general corrosion rate and localized corrosion index, many operational parameters, including warning and error messages, are available via a Modbus RTU connection.

# **11. Sensor Cleaning and Maintenance**

For best performance, severely corroded sensor metal electrodes should be replaced. Any deposit on the sensor body and near the base area of the metal electrode should be cleared. Minor corrosion product deposit on the electrode surface is acceptable. Non-corrosion product deposit such as calcium carbonate scale should be removed. The sensor should not be left in stagnant water for a long period unless measuring corrosion rate of the metal in such condition is the purpose for evaluation.

# **12. REGULATORY APPROVAL**
